By-Laws Update

Mark your calendars for June 30th for a Congregational Café. At that time the Ad Hoc Committee to Review the ByLaws, will present their reorganization plan to the congregation. The Committee was formed after the workshop led by Michael Chittum from NACCC. He had several benchmarks for church leaders.

The committee has used those benchmarks to propose changes to the bylaws and will present their proposed changes to you in outline form rather than in bylaws language. The Council has approved the changes and now it is time for the congregation to provide comments. After the Café the committee will proceed to prepare bylaws revisions for your consideration in the Fall.

Deacons

The Deacons are implementing a new plan for the summer months. Robin came up with a great name: THE SHARING TABLE. The Deacons will be preparing coffee, tea, and lemonade only. They will not be providing treats. Now, here is the sharing part. The idea is to involve the congregation in sharing something that will help us learn more about each other: what you enjoy, what you grow, what you read, your crafts—in other words, what brings you pleasure.
